Steps to follow:

1. Go to the 4-H Ontario website at:
www.4-hontario.ca.
2. In the right-hand navigation menu log-in. (Not sure how to log-in? Your name is the first letter of your first name followed by your last name - all lower case, no spaces. Your password is your membership number. Don't know your number, contact your Association Membership Coordinator.)
3. In the left-hand navigation menu (blue bar on the left) select Members/Volunteers log-in. A drop down menu appears. Select Resources. Another drop down menu appears. Select projects.
4. This brings you to the Index page of the list of projects available on-line.
5. Select the project that you need and click on it. A window will open with a list of everything that is available with this project. **These pages have been specifically designed for quick and easy downloading.**
6. The project is broken down into smaller sections so that you can choose what is best for you. Each project list begins with a copy of the complete project. Followed by each section, followed by individual pages. Once you have determined what you need, click on the title and a pdf file will open for you to print off.
